WHO KNEW?? By Tom Cusack

The Fall Team has an interesting evening planned for our November Social, scheduled for Wednesday evening, November 20th, at Cherry Hill's Carman Tilelli Community Center. Marisa Bozarth, the Museum Curator for Burlington County Parks, is our guest speaker and will present the history of Campbell Soup, our South Jersey neighbor since its founding in 1869. Hear some interesting anecdotes and inside stories of this local business that grew up to be a world-wide enterprise. In keeping with the evening's theme, the Fall Team will be serving Campbell soups and sandwiches. Check the posting in this Newsletter for all the details.

If you were wondering ...

"who is Carman Tilelli and why is the Community Center named after him?" After researching this, I found the story interesting. Carman Tilelli is the son of Carmine Tilelli, better known as Joey Giardello, the world renown boxer who was [world middleweight champion](#) from 1963 to 1965. Carmine Orlando Tilelli was born in Brooklyn in 1930, lived in South Philadelphia during his early years, and later married Rosalie and settled in Cherry Hill to raise his family of four sons. Giardello changed his name from Tilelli in an attempt to join the US Army under the legal age using his cousin's name, Giardello. He then served, underage, in an Airborne unit for the remainder of [World War II](#). He became a professional boxer in 1948, not long after his 18th birthday, and had a successful boxing career.

Giardello was inducted into the Philadelphia Sports Hall of Fame in 2009, the 3rd boxer to be inducted after Joe Frazier (2004) and Tommy Loughran (2008). He was inducted into the [International Boxing Hall of Fame](#) and the [World Boxing Hall of Fame](#) in 1993. His career record was 101 wins, 25 losses and 7 draws. Even more impressively, he was 5-3-1

against other boxers in the Hall of Fame. A public statue honoring Giardello is situated in the [East Passyunk Crossing](#) section of South Philadelphia.

He did a lot of work with the mentally handicapped, particularly for St. John of God School in Westville, New Jersey, where his son, Carman, afflicted with [Down Syndrome](#), stayed for ten years. He met the Pope, and was invited to President Kennedy's Inauguration. He participated in countless fundraising events for the mentally retarded and contributed his time and talent to the Special Olympics. At one event he taught the Special Olympians to jump rope.

I remember many a Friday night in the fifties and sixties sitting with my father watching the Gillette Cavalcade of Sports telecast the fights. I saw Joey Giardello fight many times on television. I actually met him at a South Philadelphia super market in the late sixties and he was a very warm and cordial man. You would never know that he was a boxer and held the title of Middleweight Champion of the World for several years. Joey Giardello died in 2008. His son, Carman, died in 2014.







Our Club—A Quick View

When the Fantastic 50's started May 2000, the goal was to provide interesting and varied social activities for singles over 55 years of age. Since then, the Club has sponsored thousands of activities from free concerts in local parks to trips as far away as Hong Kong, dance parties at local clubs, card games, Kimmel Center concerts, dinners, trips, outdoor events, and have formed special interest groups for photography, book club, and birding.

Members hosting events is what keeps our Club vibrant and moving forward. Event information is communicated in three forms: the Monthly Newsletter, weekly email updates called the Wednesday Wake Up, and the Club website www.fantastic50s.com. Event postings have the hosting member's name and contact information listed so you can let them know if you plan to attend. Many types of events

are posted each month, reflecting the varied interests of our members hosting these events. If you have a particular interest in an activity, and you don't see a posted event related to what you are looking for, consider hosting the event yourself. There is plenty of assistance to help you host and publicize your first event.

The Club hosts Monthly Socials from October through June, usually on the third Wednesday of the month, from 6 to 9 pm. The Socials offer an opportunity to meet other members and enjoy a nice night out. Activities at the Socials have included guest speakers, trivia night, antique roadshow, name that tune, open mic/karaoke night etc. Food and soft drinks are included in the \$10 admission charge. The Club also hosts several special events ... the Labor Day Up." Consider joining one of these Teams, Weekend Picnic, the Holiday Party in December, and our Anniversary Celebration in May.

Members volunteering is what makes our Club successful ... members hosting events, and members participating on teams that help make things happen during the year. We have four seasonal teams (Spring, Summer, Fall, Winter) that develop ideas for and host the Club Socials and special events. Members of seasonal teams are

active during their particular three month season, and then hand it off to the next seasonal team. There is also an Operational Team that handles a variety of responsibilities vital to the Club's operation .. out. Activities at the Socials have included managing the Treasury, Membership Database, and Club Website; publishing the Monthly Newsletter (i.e., editor/publisher, proof readers, production and mailing), publishing "The Wednesday Wake Up."
